Leah came to work in Mammoth for Minnie and Axel Wahlberg. She married Gerald Aitken and had 2 children, Irene Palmer and James Aitken. After Gerald passed away with cancer, she married Merl Towers. Merl later passed due to health problems.

Leah worked many jobs including: Cleaning work for the McIntyre's in their Mammoth Home and Mine Office, cleaning for the Chief Homes, Centennial Development Mine Office, Andrew Drug Store, Josie May Bailey - complete care: driving, cleaning and shopping. She also cooked for Lucille Knotts at the Summit Café, did cleaning for Pansy Treloar, Wynonna Thomas and Francis Jones. She helped Virginia Badertscher clean the Variety Store when she closed her business and worked for Gertie Ann Bray in the State Liquor Store.

Leah drove the Eureka Senior Citizen bus for shopping, picnic trips, trips for medical and for pleasure. She cleaned and maintained the bus for many years; it was all volunteer work. Leah is a member of the Young at Heart Club/Senior Citizens and also does all the decorations for their Senior Citizen Meetings. Through her volunteer work, Leah has received 14 pins, 1 Gold and 13 Silver as well as a Silver Bowl for all of her volunteer work.

Her family all played music - accordion and guitar. They had no lessons, just listened to the radio and practiced what they heard.

The accordion Leah has, was once owned by Nels Newman of Mammoth. Her friend Rudolph Matson's mother bought it for him. He had found out that she could play it, so he gave it to her to share with other people.

Today, Leah is still volunteering her time helping with the local Food Bank once a month and plays her accordion for all to enjoy. Leah is also a member of the Tintic Historical Society and volunteers her time helping out at the Tintic Mining Museum. Leah also started the Collection of Memorial Funds at the City Office, for families of those that have passed.

She had family and friends as she grew up and as far as she knows, she may be the only one left. Mary McIntyre, Ann McIntyre and many more. Back then there were three classes in one room.

Joan attended school in Mammoth, Ogden and Eureka and graduated from Tintic High School.

She met Bill Morris when she was sixteen. The war was over, and our men came home. They were married in Nevada and lived in Eureka in his mother's home. His father had passed early, and his mother in a terrible car accident. Together they had three beautiful daughters, Mickie (Gaylon) Thompson, Jackie (Dennis) Mitchell and Amy Willis. Bill was a miner and loved it. He served as Union President for years. Bill was one of many that helped bring the historic depot back to town to be used as the Museum.

Joan worked seventeen years for the Tintic School District, Chapter I. She really loved those kids and still does. She loves to see them now grown up when they stop and talk to her and loves the ones that have succeeded.

Joan has served many callings in the L. D. S. Church, Daughters of the Utah Pioneers, Member of the Tintic Historical Society, Entre-Nous Reading Club, 4-H Leader, Scout Leader, and is a member of the American Legion Auxiliary. Through many hours of research and time, Joan has put together scrapbooks of all Eureka/ Mammoth area Veterans that are currently on display at the City Office.
