#### 2022 Tintic Silver Jubilee Grand Marshals Nick & Julie Castleton



Nick was born and raised in Eureka. While growing up, Eureka was a bustling mining town of about 3,000 people. The mines in town were operating and it was a very noisy town. The trucks ran from the Chief to the dump sites along Haulage Street 24 hours a day and the train came to town every day to haul off the ore and leave empty cars to be filled for the next day. We didn't have phones or watches to tell us the time of day, but we knew the important times just by the whistles at the Chief and where the train was. The Chief blew their whistle at 8:00 AM, noon and 12:30 for lunch and 4:00 PM for quitting time. Also, the train made its last stop at the Gemini Mine and then back along Arlington past his house. Wherever he was in town he knew that when the train went past his house it was dinner time and if he wasn't home ready to eat, he would go without.

In the evening during the summer when the sun went down, we would meet at the corner of Leadville Road and Spring Street to play releveo or some other "hide and seek" game. When your mom turned on the porch light it was time to head home and get to bed. Growing up in Eureka was awesome.

Nick moved away shortly after graduating from Tintic High School in 1963. He married Carole Ann Larsen in 1968 and moved back to Eureka in 1972 with their two children. After they moved back to town, they were blessed with 2 more children. So, all four of his children were raised here also. He married Julie Ann McMahan on December 30, 2012

He worked for Johnson Tractor in Spanish Fork and then for Sumsion Construction Co. in Springville before going to work in the mill at the Burgin Mine. When the mill shut down, he worked as a mechanic at the Burgin and Trixie Mines until they closed in 1984. He then went to work as a Medic at Dugway Proving Ground where he retired in 2007. He was also a volunteer EMT on the Eureka Ambulance.

His Grandfather was elected to Eureka City Council in 1913 and 100 years later he was serving on the Eureka City Council where he served for two years before being elected to Mayor where he served for two terms (8 years). During his time as mayor, the city completed the sewer and water project, the renovation of the City Hall and he played an instrumental part in bringing Natural Gas to Eureka. He is currently a member of the Tintic Historical Society and a member of the Tintic Lodge No. 711.

Myron Jay Carpenter, 82, loving husband, father, grandfather, and great grandfather passed away at his home July 22, 2022, in Eureka, Utah.

Myron was born May 6, 1940 in the mining community of Park City, Utah to Carl Felix Carpenter and Gerta Spendlove Harvey. Shortly after he was born, the family moved to Boulder City, Nevada where Myron attended grade school and high school.

Myron met the love of his life, Paulette Sorensen, and they were married in 1962 in

Eureka, Utah. Together they moved to California where Myron worked as a carpenter and plumber for one year and then moved to Eureka, Utah where Myron started a career in mining. He first started working at the Tintic Standard as an underground miner then moved to the Bergin mine where he moved up into management. Myron was the underground superintendent and was a member of the mine rescue team at the Bergin mine. After 30 years of mining, Myron and Paulette started their own business in Eureka called the Carpenter Station and ran it for 35 years before retiring. Myron was a member of Jeep Patrol, member of the Firebird Motorcycle Club, and a member of the Eureka School Board. Later in their life they enjoyed spending time at the Hale Center Theater watching plays.

Myron was initiated into the Protective Order of Elks, Tintic Lodge #711 in Eureka, Utah in 1963. He held multiple chairs and was a lifetime member. He proudly served as the Elks Lodge #711 Exalted Ruler from 1975-1976, District Deputy Grand Exalted ruler from 1982-1983 and State President from 1986-1987. Myron was particularly proud of one of his greatest accomplishments which was traveling throughout the state to meet with the local Elk Lodges while directing 17 committees. Myron was dedicated and passionate about his involvement with the Elks and loved to give back to help the community including the Veteran Memorial Center in Salt Lake, Camp Wapiti and other charities and civic projects for youth and the elderly.
