DONALD AND DAWN CHRISTENSEN ARE LIFELONG MEMBERS OF THE TINTIC COMMUNITY WHOSE ROOTS, FAMILY, AND SERVICE HAVE LONG BEEN INTERTWINED WITH THE HISTORY AND HEART OF EUREKA, UTAH. BOTH ATTENDED SCHOOL IN EUREKA FROM ELEMENTARY THROUGH GRADUATION. THE TWO EVENTUALLY BEGAN DATING AND LATER MARRIED. THIS JULY, THEY CELEBRATED THEIR 33RD ANNIVERSARY.

THEY RAISED THEIR TWO CHILDREN, MATTHEW (BORN 1996) AND PATIA (BORN 1999), IN EUREKA. THROUGHOUT THEIR CHILDREN'S SCHOOL YEARS, DONALD AND DAWN WERE DEEPLY INVOLVED IN SUPPORTING LOCAL ACTIVITIES, ATHLETICS, AND COMMUNITY FUNDRAISERS. AMONG THESE CONTRIBUTIONS, THEY ARE ESPECIALLY PROUD TO HAVE HELPED LEAD EFFORTS TO IMPROVE THE COMMUNITY PARK BY INSTALLING A PLAYGROUND—WORKING ALONGSIDE VOLUNTEERS AND DONORS TO CREATE A SAFE, FUN SPACE FOR LOCAL CHILDREN. THE PROJECT BECAME A MEANINGFUL SYMBOL OF THEIR COMMITMENT TO MAKING EUREKA A BETTER PLACE FOR FAMILIES.

AFTER THE TRAGIC PASSING OF THEIR DAUGHTER PATIA, THE CHRISTENSENS WERE OVERWHELMED BY THE COMPASSION AND STRENGTH SHOWN BY THE PEOPLE OF EUREKA. WANTING TO GIVE BACK AND FULFILL THE COMMITMENT TO KEEP PATIA'S MEMORY ALIVE, THEY CREATED THE PATIA LYNN MEMORIAL RUN, WHICH THEY ORGANIZED A YEAR AFTER HER PASSING AND CONTINUED FOR TEN YEARS. THE RUN SUPPORTED A WIDE RANGE OF CAUSES, INCLUDING THE COMPASSIONATE FRIENDS, A PEER-SUPPORT ORGANIZATION FOR FAMILIES WHO HAVE LOST A CHILD. AFTER A DECADE, THEY PASSED THE EVENT ON TO TINTIC HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETICS, WHERE IT CONTINUES TODAY IN PATIA'S MEMORY. IN 2017—THE YEAR PATIA WOULD HAVE GRADUATED—THEY AWARDED THE FIRST PATIA LYNN CHRISTENSEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP, A TRADITION THEY ARE PROUD TO CONTINUE EACH YEAR FOR DESERVING TINTIC STUDENTS.

DONALD AND DAWN REMAIN DEVOTED TO THEIR HOMETOWN AND ARE ACTIVE MEMBERS OF THE EUREKA BPOE 711 LODGE, WHERE DAWN SERVES AS TREASURER AND DONALD AS TRUSTEE. TOGETHER WITH THEIR DEDICATED OFFICERS AND MEMBERS, THEY SUPPORT SUB FOR SANTA, SCHOLARSHIPS, SCHOOL LUNCH ASSISTANCE, ATHLETIC PROGRAMS, AND MANY OTHER COMMUNITY NEEDS. THEY ARE EXTREMELY PROUD OF THEIR SON MATTHEW, WHO RECENTLY MOVED TO MAPLETON BUT RETURNS HOME OFTEN. AT THE TIME OF THIS ANNOUNCEMENT, MATTHEW IS PREPARING FOR A SIX-MONTH DEPLOYMENT, AND DONALD AND DAWN COULD NOT BE PROUDER OF HIS SERVICE.

IN THEIR FREE TIME, THE CHRISTENSENS ENJOY TRAVELING, CAMPING, SIDE-BY-SIDE ADVENTURES, GOLFING, AND SPENDING TIME WITH FAMILY AND FRIENDS. ABOVE ALL, THEY ARE GRATEFUL TO STILL CALL EUREKA HOME AND CONTINUE TO LOVE AND SERVE THE COMMUNITY THAT HAS SUPPORTED THEM THROUGH EVERY CHAPTER OF THEIR LIVES.

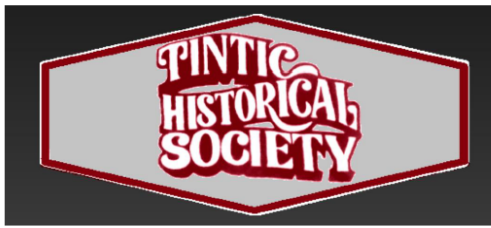
