**French Toast Casserole** 

Prep 10 Min. \* Total 8 Hr. 50 Min. \* Servings 8

#### Ingredients

#### Casserole

- 1 loaf challah or French bread (1 lb), cut into 1-inch slices
- 8eggs
- 2 cups whole, low-fat (2%) or soy milk
- 1 cup half-and-half
- 4 teaspoons packed light brown sugar
- 1/2teaspoon salt
- 1/4teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon vanilla

#### Topping

- 2 tablespoons unsalted butter, cut into small cubes
- 3 tablespoons granulated sugar
- 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1/2 cup chopped pecans
- Maple-flavored or real maple syrup, if desired

#### Steps

- Butter bottom only of 13x9-inch (3-quart) glass baking dish. Place bread slices in 2 rows, overlapping each other on an angle, in baking dish.
- In large bowl, beat eggs, milk, half-and-half, brown sugar, salt, 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon, the
  nutmeg and vanilla until thoroughly combined. Carefully pour mixture over slices, making sure
  each slice is completely coated. Cover baking dish with foil or plastic wrap; refrigerate 8 hours or
  overnight.
- At serving time, heat oven to 350°F. Uncover baking dish; sprinkle butter, granulated sugar, 2 teaspoons cinnamon and the pecans over bread.
- · Bake 40 minutes or until golden brown. Serve with maple syrup.

At the age of 2 John moved with his family to Eureka, Utah where he attended Eureka Elementary and Tintic High School, graduating in 1960. While in high school he met the love of his life, Brenda Gourley.

On September 9, 1960 John joined the United States Marine Corp. After spending a year overseas, he came home on furlough and he and Brenda were married on April 21, 1962. John's favorite things were spending time with his family, camping at Fish Lake, having family dinners, hunting deer and pine nuts, dancing and enjoying his wife's delicious cooking.

He is survived by his loving wife, Brenda; his three kids, Becky (Brian) Underwood, Kristi (JB) Hannifin and Derrick (April) Sutherland; 8 grandchildren and 10 great grandchildren who were the gems of his life; brothers,

Craig (Betty) Sutherland of Arizona, Kerry (Cathy) Sutherland of Denver, Colorado and sister Ann (James) Anderson of Arizona. He was preceded in death by his parents, his sister Sylvia and his in-laws, Babe and Erma Gourley.

#### **Necessary Documentation**

- Government issued picture ID.
- Social Security cards for you and EVERYONE living in your household.
- A copy of your power, heat and water bills.
- Proof of ALL income received by all household members in the month prior to the month of your application.
- Proof of any eligible medical expenses, child support and alimony you paid in the month prior to the month of your application.
- Proof of disability, if applicable.
- Proof of birthdate for a child age six (6) or under.
- Additional documentation, if required.
