- In 2024 there will be partisan primary elections.
 Additionally, the Republican Party has chosen to hold a Presidential Preference Poll in conjunction with their statewide caucus meetings. According to State Law, political parties set rules regarding who may participate in their primary election caucuses.
- Your party affiliation may determine which ballot you receive, and which primary or caucus you may participate in. The party of your choosing will remain in effect through the June primary election and cannot be changed after the deadline listed below
- The party affiliation deadline: Tuesday January 9, 2024 at 5:00pm. <u>Please do not wait until the deadline to</u> <u>make any changes.</u>

Tiny Tintic FFA Team Gets Gold at Nationals

Forty teams across the nation sent State Champion teams in Milk Quality to Indianapolis, IN, last week to compete. The Tintic High School team, Ayva Ezell, Samantha Grimstead, Kanese Allinson, Alle Young, and Coach Mrs. Warnick, represented Utah after winning first place last spring. Only fourteen (14) teams were awarded gold.

Tintic High School has less than 140 students in grades seventh through twelfth and this was only their third year the FFA has been in the high school. These young ladies spend countless hours after school studying to prepare plus the hours in school with Mrs. Warnick.

Kanese Allinson was also on the State Championship Forestry Team that went to Nationals last year and received a silver. That is two State Championship teams for Tintic High School in three years of existence: a remarkable achievement.

REMINDER TO EUREKA CITIZENS

Winter is here! Eureka City would like to remind all citizens about Parking on the City Streets.

Ordinance No. 05-14-2013-2 Winter Parking Ordinance was adopted to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of this community by preserving our ability to plow the winter snows and keep our roads safe for all to enjoy.

It shall be unlawful to park, leave or abandon a vehicle on any portion of a City Street or right of way of a city street beginning November 1 to March 31. No parking at any time if there is any snow accumulation within the travel lanes regardless of date. Vehicles include but are not limited to automobiles, trucks, trailers, mobile homes, travel trailers, boats, buses, ATV's, snowmobiles, or any device used in the transportation of humans, animals, or freight of any kind.

Vehicles remaining on City Streets under these conditions are subject to being towed at owners' expense.

For Home Plowers: Please do not plow snow from your property into the street and leave it. Please cleanup all windrows you happen to leave in the street if you plow across a street. Leaving windrows in the street could cause an accident or damage to vehicles.

We would also like to remind those that have a fire hydrant close to their property to try and keep the snow cleared from around that hydrant in case of an emergency.

Let's all try and work together, help our neighbors and those in need to make our town safe for all to enjoy.
