We had our first water main break this week do to the construction project. The contractors are doing their best to try not to interrupt your water service, but these things are bound to happen. We are working to mark all of the lines that we know of, but there are some places where we are bound to find lines that don't appear on any map. I would advise everyone to keep a pitcher of water in the fridge just in case. If you notice that you are suddenly loosing water pressure, you can assume there has been a water main breach so I would hurry to fill a five gallon bucket or something so you can use it to flush the toilet if necessary, or if you can, just keep a bucket of water handy. We are still going to hang notices on the doors of any homes that we are scheduled to be shut off. We hope to keep unforeseen outages to a minimum, but no one can see down into the ground, so we need to be prepared and have some patience.

NAUDINE IRENE NAEF 1926—2015

Naudine entered into a new life on Monday, May 25th, 2015 at age 88. She was born to Jacob and Bettie (Mills) Naef in Scofield, Utah, high in the mountains about 9000 feet

in a log cabin. Scofield was a mining town and Jake was working in the coal mines.

Naudine is the seventh of eight children all delivered by a mid-wife. Naudine is survived by a sister Audrey Sanderson of Eureka, Utah and many niece's and nephew's.

Not sure when the family moved from Scofield to Eureka, Utah, where Jake worked in the silver and ore mines. Sometime during the early forties, she moved to Burbank, California living with her sister Ruby. She worked as an operator for the telephone company before moving back to Utah working in the automotive industry. Returning to California in the late fifties, continuing to work in the automotive industry as a bookkeeper, then office manager at Water's Dodge for thirty years before retiring. Naudine always had a new car to drive and when retiring, Water's gave her a new car. She was so tickled.

Naudine lived in the Los Angeles area of Hollywood, Chatsworth, Eagle Rock before moving to Huntington Beach in 2006 in Huntington Terrace, an assisted care facility. Her health had been deteriorating and she needed assistance from family.

Naudine was an avid Dodger fan and Laker fan. We all will miss her jokes (she had many), her wonderful harmonica playing and elaborate storytelling.



Lyman William Davis passed away at home in Eureka June 12, 2015. He was born to William and Golda Davis April 20, 1936 in Silver City, Utah. After a time the family moved to Eureka where he graduated from Tintic High School in 1954. He joined the US Army and served two years driving in

France and Germany. After he left the Army he moved to California with his sister. There he met and married JoAnn Millerick and they had two children, Mark and Michelle. They later divorced. Lyman then married Eileen Eckert and they retired back to Utah in 1984.

While in California Lyman worked for Dodge assembling cars and then for Lever Brothers on their production lines. After they moved back to Utah, Lyman managed Batteries Plus in Lindon until he fully retired in Eureka.

Lyman loved Eureka and its rich history. He had the gift of gab and loved to volunteer at the museum downtown to tell his tales of Eureka to the visitors. Eureka has truly lost a gem.

He is survived by his wife Eileen; his children, Mark (Heidi) Davis of Eureka, Michelle (Don) Aydon of Southlake, Texas; four grandsons, Dustin, Brent, Connor and Devin; and a granddaughter, Kinzley; as well as four stepsons, Glenn, Kevin, Bryan and Tim Eckert. He was preceded in death by his parents and three sisters, Frances Sellers, Mildred Davis and Betty Finch.

There will be a viewing at the Brown Family Mortuary, 66 So. 300 East, Santaquin on Thursday, June 18th from 6:00 to 8:00 pm and again at the mortuary Friday from 9:45 to 10:45 am prior to funeral services at 11:00 am.

William L. Sorensen, 81 years old died in Grants, New Mexico, Friday, June 5th, 2015. Bill was born Sept 18, 1933 in Moroni, Utah to Byron H. and Laverne Gillespie Sorensen. Bill grew up in Mammoth and Eureka, Utah, graduated from Tintic High School in 1951, and entered the

Army in 1952. Bill was honorably discharged in 1954 and went to work for Centennial Development Company. In 1963 he was promoted to project superintendent and in 1964 was in charge of special projects in Alaska for Bear Creek Mining Company. He later moved to Grants, New Mexico to work in the uranium mines.

Bill being the true entrepreneur that he was, left the mining business and in 1969 formed a partnership with Francis W. McCabe and opened LaVentana Steakhouse in Grants, New Mexico. Bill took on many business ventures including a Santa Fe, NM liquor store, a second restaurant in Gallup, NM and IBC Records in Nashville, Tennessee. After the death of his partner Frank McCabe, the partnership transferred to Frank's wife Robin, and continued until he formed a partnership with long-time employee and friend, Stephanie Matkovich. In 2002 they sold LaVentana and in 2006 opened the WOW Diner. Bill was a Grants City Councilman for many years and was a member of the New Mexico Amigos. Bill was instrumental in the formation of the Coyote Del Malpais Golf Course and helped to initiate the beautification of Grants by donating trees to be planted along Main Street (Route 66). Bill was a true gentleman, mentor and friend. He was a very generous person who touched many lives, had many friends and will be greatly missed by all who worked for him and knew him through the years.

Bill is survived by his brother Byron P. Sorensen of Provo, Utah. There will be a Celebration of Bill's Life at LaVentana Steakhouse in Grants, New Mexico, Wednesday, June 10th from 11:00 am to 2:00 pm. On Monday, June 15, 2015, at 11:00 am, a Funeral Service will be held at the Brown Mortuary in Santaquin, Utah. Interment will be at the Santaquin City Cemetery immediately following the service. After the graveside service a reception for family and friends will be held at the Cultural Hall in the LDS Church in Eureka, Utah.
