Bruce Don Rusby lost his battle with cancer on April 27, 2015. He died peacefully at his home in Pittsburgh, PA. In preparation for his journey, Bruce asked his wife of 10 years for a \$5 bill, his jacket and the king size bed. He

loved that bed. Bruce was 63-years old.

At his request, no service will be held. Bruce is survived by his wife, Jeannette Cooke-Rusby of Pittsburgh, PA; his sons, Jared (Jen) of Sundance, UT and Terry (Monteria) of Provo, UT; his stepchildren, Jenna Casteel Blake and Evan Casteel both of WV and five grandchildren.

Born September 3, 1951 in Payson, UT,

Bruce grew up in the small mining community of Mammoth, UT. He enjoyed exploring the abandoned mines, sparking his interest at an early age in the drilling and mining industry where he would later work for over three decades. He would terrorize his cousin, Bonita who he would place on the back of his dirt bike and hit every bump and whoop he could find all while laughing hysterically.

Upon graduation from Tintic High School, Bruce married his first wife, Carol and (appropriate time elapsed) welcomed their two sons. They settled in the big city of Eureka, UT (population 766) where sagebrush outnumber residents. On Sundays, he would take the boys to Grandma Rusbys where they would congregate with family and enjoy the ever-elusive recipe (please email) of breakfast roll-ups.

Bruce would later relocate to Pittsburgh, PA where he would remain and married his current wife, Jeanette.

He served as Executive Vice President of Operations with Target Drilling, Inc. for the last 18 years. His vocation took him to locations around the world, but he was most comfortable at home (in his king-size bed) and surrounded by loved ones.

Generous to a fault and never expecting anything in return, Bruce once graciously treated the entire family and extended family to a Disney World vacation. He was kind and gentle, a bear of a man with

the heart of an Angel. He was quick to laugh and loved watching slapstick comedy. He had an unorthodox golf swing (Charles Barkley) but enjoyed playing the game when his time would allow.

His love of bikes extended into his golden years, when he achieved his lifelong dream of owning a Harley. Bruce was a member of the Firebirds Motorcycle Club and The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks.

Bruce also leaves behind his beloved sister, Diana Jones (Wayne), his favorite niece and nephew (he only had one of each!) and numerous cousins. He is preceded in death by his parents Don A. and Dorathy J. Spencer Rusby of Milan, NM and brother Terry who died in infancy.

Bruce was always first to respond with an I love you and last to hang up the phone. He was interested in what you had to say and how you were feeling, even as he was losing his life. Well, Bruce, we love you too and will hold you in our hearts always.
