He loved hunting, camping, golf, and especially spending time with family and friends. He had a gift for instantly making friends with any new person he met. All who knew him loved him. He loved living in Eureka and referred to it as God's country. He spent hours sitting on his front porch looking forward to someone stopping by to shoot the breeze. One of his favorite things to do was recite poems around the campfire. His poems, songs, and stories will live on in the hearts of all who knew him.

He is survived by his wife, Deanna Wall Sorensen; son, Michael (Amy) Sorensen; grandsons, Kamryn and Kaysen Sorensen all of Eureka. Also a sister, Paulette (Myron) Carpenter of Eureka. - \* Building Permits are Required within the City Limits for projects such as a new home, garage, any outbuilding larger than 200 sq. ft., electrical, plumbing, remodeling (where there is any structural modifications made), solar panels, wind generators, etc.
- \* <u>All Dogs</u> are Required to have their Rabies Vaccination and be Licensed every year with Eureka City and Dogs Running at Large is prohibited.
- \* Film Permits are required for any type of filming within the City Limits.
- \* Mass Gathering Permits are required for any event where 100 or more people are attending (excluding School Activities) within City Limits.
