## **Eureka City News**

#### Animal Licenses:

Eureka City is in the process of setting up the Animal Clinic for 2020. We have been in contact with the Nebo Animal Clinic to set up a date, but they are unable to come up at this time due to the COVID-19 situation. As soon as we hear from them, we will post flyers around town informing everyone of a date and time for the clinic. If your dog already has its rabies shot, you may come into the City Office during regular hours with the proof of Rabies Shot and you can buy your dog license.

As a reminder, <u>ALL DOGS</u> that are six months or older within Eureka City <u>MUST BE</u> <u>LICENSED</u>, whether they are in your home or out in the yard. Rabies vaccinations are required prior to the City issuing a license.

Kennel licenses are required for anyone owning or keeping three or more dogs. Running at Large is prohibited, all dogs must be kept on a leash or in a fenced yard.

#### Nuisances:

In July 2017, the Eureka City Council passed an Ordinance enacting regulations and abatement of Nuisances for the beautification of the City of Eureka. The Ordinance was to promote the health, safety, morals, convenience, order, prosperity and general welfare of Eureka and its residents.

We would like to encourage all Residents to get out and clean up their property help make Eureka a better place to live.

#### **Building Permits:**

We are seeing a lot of construction activity around town. Before building, remodeling, or renovating, please check with the City Office to see if a building permit and/or excavation permit is required prior to commencing any work. These are just some of the items requiring a permit: Buildings/sheds that is 200 sq. ft. and over, anything attached to your home or structure including porches, decks and carports, any Plumbing or Electrical, and heating (including furnace replacement)

These permits are in place to help protect you as a homeowner as well as the City.

### **Business Licenses:**

Eureka City has an Ordinance requiring a license to operate within the city limits. Below are a couple sections copied out of the ordinance which describe what a business is, who is required to get a license as well any penalty's for not getting a license.

#### BUSINESS LICENSE REQUIRED:

- A. It shall be a Class B Misdemeanor, subject to penalty as provided in Utah Code 76-3-301, for any person to transact, engage in, or carry on any business, trade, profession, calling or to operate a vending, pinball, or coin operated machine without first receiving the class or type of license required by the City. The period of such license will be for one year.
- B. A special short-term business permit may be issued by the Mayor, City Manager, or Recorder for retail sales at booths, concession stands, fruit stands, etc... for a period not to exceed seven (7) days. The fee for this permit shall be set by resolution of the City Council.

Eureka City has a Code Enforcement Officer now who will be out enforcing these ordinances.

BUSINESS: Includes all activities engaged in within the City carried on for the purpose of gain or economic profit, except that in the acts of employees rendering service to employers shall not be included in the term "business", unless otherwise specifically provided.

If you currently have a commercial business license issued by Eureka City, and would like to have a sidewalk sale in front of your business; or a home business and would like to set up in one of our booth spaces at the park, you will not need the temporary license, but you must contact the committee to let them know you will be selling.

You may also be interested in purchasing a banner to be put on display during the celebration. These banners not only help support our celebration, but is great advertisement for your business. The price for a new banner is \$300,00. If you have already purchased a banner in a previous year, there is a small fee of \$50,00 for renewal for it to be displayed this year.

## Donations can be an item for our raffle or a monetary donation to help with the costs of the events we are sponsoring such as the Ice Cream Social, and much more.

## Taco Salad III

- \* 16 ounces lean ground beef
- \* 1 (1.25 ounce) package taco seasoning mix
- \* 1 head iceberg lettuce, shredded
- \* 1 red onion, sliced
- \* 1 bunch green onions, chopped
- \* 1 (15 ounce) can pinto beans, drained
- \* 1 (15 ounce) can kidney beans, drained
- \* 2 large tomatoes, chopped
- \* 1 (16 ounce) package corn chips



- \* 8 ounces shredded Cheddar cheese
- \* 1 avocados peeled, pitted, and cubed
- \* 1 (16 ounce) bottle Catalina salad dressing

### **Directions:**

Step 1 - Prepare the ground beef as directed by taco seasoning package and set aside.

Step 2 - In a large bowl, combine the beef mixture, lettuce, red onion, green onion, pinto beans, kidney beans, tomatoes, avocado and cheese. Mix well.

Step 3 - Before serving, add the corn chips and enough dressing to coat. Mix well and serve immediately.

## **Creamy Caramel Flan**

### Ingredients

- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup water
- 1 package (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened
- 5 large eggs
- 1 can (14 ounces) sweetened condensed milk
- 1 can (12 ounces) evaporated milk
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

### Directions

- 1. In a heavy saucepan, cook sugar and water over medium-low heat until melted and golden, about 15 minutes. Brush down crystals on the side of the pan with additional water as necessary. Quickly pour into an ungreased 2-qt. round baking or souffle dish, tilting to coat the bottom; let stand for 10 minutes.
- 2. In a bowl, beat the cream cheese until smooth. Beat in eggs, 1 at a time, until thoroughly combined. Add remaining ingredients; mix well. Pour over caramelized sugar.
- **3.** Place the dish in a larger baking pan. Pour boiling water into larger pan to a depth of 1 in. Bake at 350° for 50-60 minutes or until center is just set (mixture will jiggle).
- 4. Remove dish from a larger pan to a wire rack; cool for 1 hour. Refrigerate overnight.
- 5. To unmold, run a knife around edges and invert onto a large rimmed serving platter. Cut into wedges or spoon onto dessert plates; spoon sauce over each serving.

TOTAL TIME: Prep: 25 min. + standing Bake: 50 min. + chilling YIELD: 10 servings.
