NATURAL GAS

How was Eureka City chosen as Dominion Energy Utah's first natural gas expansion project?

Multiple rural communities were surveyed to determine their interest in natural gas. All potential communities have been evaluated according to:

- Project cost
- The number of potential new customers
- The impact on current Dominion Energy Utah operations and current infrastructure

Of the communities that responded, Eureka City Right now, they have some low numbers of residents was chosen to be the first project to be built under House Bill 422. Eureka City's population is currently 739. Estimates are that its population will increase to 850 by 2020, double in the next five years and triple in the next 20+ years.

When will construction begin?

This project will be the first to be built under House Bill 422. If the Utah Public Service Commission grants approval of the construction would start in early 2021, with an concerning the natural gas connection: in-service date of late 2021. This project will include . 11 miles of high-pressure pipeline and about 360 service lines to homes, businesses, etc. Preliminary routing is underway.

If I live in Eureka City and want to get natural gas, how do I find out more about this project?

If you'd like to sign up for natural gas service in . Eureka, fill out and submit a service-line request form. Once you've completed and submitted the form, a pre-construction representative will contact you to set up an appointment.

Will Dominion Energy Utah expand natural gas to other cities who need it?

The company views rural expansion under House Bill 422 as an ongoing program with each project • subject to Utah Public Service Commission approval.

This service is being offered to the residents of Eureka through a grant. The residents will not have to pay anything to have the gas line ran to their home as long as they would be able to hook on and use the gas within two years from the date of installation.

Residents will be responsible to pay for any gas lines or conversions for their appliances within their home and would need to contact a plumbing or heating contractor *licensed* to do this type of work and pay for an inspection.

So, if you are interested in finding more information out about the natural gas installation and how it may affect you as a homeowner, please contact Dominion Energy Utah.

Here is a breakdown of the process Eureka Residents project, should follow if they would like more information

- Visit Dominion Energy's Website: https:// www.dominionenergy.com/projects-and-facilities/ natural-gas-projects/utah-rural-expansion/eureka to fill out and submit a service line request, or stop at the City Office and fill out a service line request to set up an appointment to meet with a Dominion Representative.
- A representative will come out and meet with the resident, measure the distance they will have to run their natural gas line (they are only responsible to run it to the corner of the home), and answer any questions the resident may have.
- The resident will then receive an invoice for what the cost for the hookup would be if the resident does not hook up or use the natural gas within two years of installation.
- Contact a plumbing or heating contractor licensed to work with natural gas lines and appliances for any in-home work.
- Schedule the final inspection for the gas line connection by calling the City Office to schedule the Building Inspector.
