*Xpress Bill Pay: A Trusted Way to Pay* We have partnered with Xpress Bill Pay, the premier provider for online payment systems. When you sign up for online bill payment, you will get a secure password to access your personal account at xpressbillpay.com. Every month we'll send you a reminder email to let you know when your bill is online. You can pay your bill from just about anywhere via computer or mobile device. All you need is access to the internet through a web browser. You then log in to your account using your email address and password, or you can sign in using our app. No need to worry about late payments if you're out of town when your bill is due. Select a payment type — credit card, debit card, or you can transfer funds directly from your checking account (aka: eCheck). — enter the requested information, and you're done! It's that easy, and it only takes you a few minutes

## Q: Does it cost anything to sign up for online payments?

## A: No. It's free to sign up for online payments and to use the service.

Q: What other information is available? A: You can view up to two years' history of your account online, so you can compare your current bill to a previous bill. Q: Is my information safe?

A: Absolutely. All the transactions are handled on secure servers. As long as you don't give out your password, only you will be able to access your account. Plus, your personal information or email address will not be sold or rented to third parties for marketing purposes without your permission

## **ORDINANCE NO. 05-14-2013-2**

## AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS ALONG ALL CITY STREETS WITHIN THE EUREKA CITY LIMITS.

#### Be it ordained and enacted by the council of the City of Eureka, State of Utah as follows:

## **SECTION A - DEFININTIONS:**

For the purpose of this section, "City Street" shall be defined as being from curb to curb or, being property line to property line.

## **SECTION B - STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:**

It is the purpose of this ordinance to promote the public health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of this community by preserving our ability to plow the winter snows and keep our roads safe for all to enjoy.

## SECTION C - Unlawful to Park, Leave or Abandon:

It shall be unlawful to park, leave or abandon a vehicle on any portion of a City Street or right of way of a city street beginning November 1 to March 31. No parking at any time if there is any snow accumulation within the travel lanes regardless of date. Vehicles include but are not limited to automobiles, trucks, trailers, mobile homes, travel trailers, boats, buses, ATV's, snowmobiles, or any device used in the transportation of humans, animals, or freight of any kind.

## **SECTION D** - Vehicles Subject to Tow:

Vehicles remaining on City Streets under these conditions are subject to being towed at owners' expense.

## **SECTION E - Penalty:**

A violation of this Section will be considered a Class C misdemeanor.

This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and posting as provided by law.

PASSED AND APPROVED AND MADE EFFECTIVE MAY 14, 2013.

## Crock-Pot Sweet Potato Casserole

## **INGREDIENTS**

Cooking spray

4 lb. Sweet Potatoes, peeled and finely diced

4 tbsp. Melted Butter

2 c. Packed Brown Sugar

1/4 c. Water

1 tsp. Ground Cinnamon

1/2 tsp. Pure Vanilla Extract

Pinch Kosher Salt

1 1/2 c Mini Marshmallows

1/2 c. Whole Pecans

- 1. Grease Crock-Pot with cooking spray and place sweet potatoes in slow cooker.
- 2. In a medium bowl, combine butter, sugar, water, cinnamon, vanilla, and a pinch of salt. Whisk to combine. Pour over sweet potatoes and toss until they are fully coated. Cook on high for 4 hours, stirring every hour.
- 3. Remove lid and top with marshmallows and pecans. Reduce heat to low and cover. Cook on high about 10 minutes more or until marshmallows are melted.
