Five years ago, David was diagnosed with lung cancer, resulting in the removal of his right lung. After five years, the cancer returned and spread rapidly, causing him to pass away at his home on September 18, 2015.

Notice is hearby given that the Juab County Commission will hold a Public Hearing at the Tintic School District Office, at 55 East Main Eureka, Utah on Wednesday October 21, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. to allow equal time for presentations of arguments in favor of, and against Ballot Proposition #1. This proposition will be on all ballots in Juab County for the November 3, 2015 election.

Shall Juab County, Utsh, be authorized to impose a .25% sales and use tax for all purposes authorized by Utsh Code Annotated 59-12-2219(8) which includes: (1) class B roads: (2) class C roads; (3) traffic and pedestnian safety, including for a class B road or class C road for: a sidewalk, curb and gutter, a safety feature, a traffic sign, a traffic signal, street lighting or a combination of the foregoing; (4) the construction, maintenance, or operation of an active transportation facility that is for nonmotorized vehicles and multimodal transportation and connects an origin with a destination; (5) public transit system services; or (6) any combination of (1) through (5)?

JUAB COUNTY COLD CASES SOLVED 09/30/2015

Through DNA evidence the Juab County Sheriff's Office has been able to close 2 unidentified body cases.

Case 1: November 1996 at Juab Lake ...

A human skull and several other bones were found at Juab Lake. The bones were sent to the State Medical Examiner's office. Recent DNA matches from samples were used to identify the victim as Rene A. Romero, a 4 year old boy from Reno Nevada. Follow-up with Reno confirmed the Rene had been murdered by his mother and stepfather on November 24, 1994. They have been prosecuted and sentenced for his murder even though the body was not identified until this DNA match.

Case 2: September 1978 at Yuba Reservoir

A female body was located at Yuba Reservoir. The body was taken to the State Medical Examiner's officer where it was determined she died from strangulation. Her identity remained unknown until recent DNA matched a missing person report from August 22 1978 in Long Beach California. California authorities have been notified and have re-opened the case on the now identified Marilee Bruszer, who was 33 years old at the time of her disappearance. California authorities are now investigating the case as a homicide.
