Shay said CIB has a couple of specific things that need to be mentioned during the public hearing. The public hearing is for the CIB and the CIB application. The application was for \$147,690 total with \$97,690 from CIB in grant funding or loan. They want to know how the city would fund the loan. Shay said he assumed the city would pay for the loan with funds from the water account. Mayor Jenkins reiterated the city was asking for a total of \$147,390 in grant funding. Council Member Maxfield said if we get a loan then we would pay it from the funds in the account but would likely need to have a rate increase. Council Member Atherley asked how much the increase would be. We don't know how much right now. If the loan is for the full amount the estimate would be around \$20 per household.

Mayor Jenkins opened the meeting for public comments.

Krystal Gout asked what CIB stood for and what exactly the money would be used for. Mayor Jenkins explained that CIB stands for Community Impact Board. The money would be used to redesign the chlorination system and fix the booster pumps. This should stop the problem we are having right now from happening again. She asked if the problem was due to negligence. We believe it is a design flaw. Scott Pugh said let's fix it right, so we don't have a problem in the future. Dan Fechner explained in detail what the problem is. Council Member Clements commented the boosters have been replaced several times. Scott asked if the check valves were included. Dan explained they plan on replacing the gate valves. Council Member Davis asked about changing where the chlorination enters the water. He suggested it at the tank. Dan explained how that process works and that it would be a substantial cost to the city to do it. Krystal asked if the project needs to go out to bid. The project is required to go out to bid. No more comments were made. Mayor Jenkin asked for a motion to close the meeting.

ADJOURNMENT Council Member Nedreberg made a motion to close the public hearing. Council Member Davis seconded the motion. Mayor Jenkins called a roll call vote all in favor meeting closed.
