DISCUSSION ITEMS

Shay Morrison, Community Advisor.

He provided updates on the DTA program, which contracts with FEMA to help with funding opportunities after wildfires. The DTA program is coordinating with JUB on the current plan and will work with Miranda Miller to move forward with funding once the plan is completed. The HMGP and BRIC programs under FEMA are lengthy processes and may take several years. He mentioned updating the annexation policy plan. He offered to help the Planning Commission revise their existing plan due to recent legislative updates. He presented a new Recreation Committee Resolution and Bylaws that establish a flexible advisory committee structure without specifying exact member numbers. The Council agreed to review it further before making a final decision. The emergency response plan he wrote is based on Aurora City's model, which includes details on command structure, evacuations, meeting locations, and NIMS certification requirements.

Dan Fechner, City Engineer – Eureka Transportation Plan.

He discussed the booster station project instead of the Transportation Plan. The bids for the booster station are due next week. The pre-bid meeting will be held tomorrow. The NRCS funding process involves high-level modeling and will take time to complete.

120 Water.

The Council had concerns over the pricing and discussed other alternatives. In the meantime, they will focus on updating the existing GIS system.

Rural Water Fall Conference.

Maintenance Technician Tyler Elliott, Mayor Jenkins, and Council Member Maxfield will be attending the fall conference. It was suggested they look staying at an Airbnb instead of a hotel. It might be more cost effective.

WUI Ordinance & Map.

Mayor Jenkins said the WUI (Wildland Urban Interface) was approved months ago but the required ordinance and map has not been adopted. He would like to revisit the map due to changes from the recent fire. The red areas showing high fuel risk on the north side of town are now burned, potentially reducing risk levels. The Council discussed whether to create their own map or push back on the State's assessment.

Juab County EMS Relicensure.

Clinton Painter said they must relicense the EMS about every 3-4 years. He would like to see Eureka remain with Juab County EMS rather than putting out an RFP to other agencies. Mayor Jenkins commented that during the fire they were wonderful to work with. He personally doesn't see the point in changing.

Recreation Committee:

Vendor Data, Investigation.

Parks and Memorials.

Mayor Jenkins said we had received resignations from the Recreation Committee members Jessica Nielsen and JaNeel Nielsen, and (non-member) Travis Haynes. There was an explanation as why these people resigned. There was also a discussion on compliance issues with the Committee. The discussion turned to the tension and communication issues between the members of the committee, city staff, and Mayor. This is something that needs to be worked on.
