EUREKA CITY COUNCIL WORK MEETING JUNE 4, 2018

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

A. Bryan Kessinger, Utah Department of Workforce Services – Job Program Bryan Kessinger discussed the work program for summer hires. The City has \$5,000 in the budget for summer hires. He said how about stretching that money and hiring about 6-7 kids for the same amount of money. He said one of the programs is the Employment Internship Opportunity. It takes individuals between the ages of 14-24 and sets up an internship where the State of Utah would pay 100% of their wages. He would like to pay them \$10.00 per hour. The other program is On the Job Training this is for Adults. The City would be reimbursed 50% of their wages. Bryan introduced Cris Durbin and he is the Training Counselor over the youth program. Cris said to qualify the kids must meet certain risk factors. Eligibility must be determined before the State will pay their wages. The kids apply, take a TABE Test, which is a basic skills test, and turn in verification. Once eligible, the training counselor helps the kids develop an employment plan. Council Member Kirgan asked if there were other factors or eligibility requirements. Cris said there is a list of requirements he only mentioned a few of them. Mr. Kessinger asked if the Council wanted to vote. The Council Members present were in favor of the program, but a vote could not be taken at the work meeting it must be done at a regular council meeting.

B. Budget Amendments for FY Ending June 30, 2018

Recorder Bigler read over the budget. The General Fund had a difference of \$18,672 overage but June is not included. She also mentioned that the \$35,000 trail grant the City received was in the

income but also needs to be put in the expenses. Council Member Kirgan had additional grant money of \$35,000 added to the Park income but not listed anywhere as an expense. Recorder Bigler was not sure what the Council wanted to do about it because Council Member Kirgan had not put in for any grants yet. Mayor Castleton asked where the grant money was located. It is under the Inter-Governmental Revenue.

Mayor Castleton brought up the status of the City Hall Renovation. The plans including the metal roof were finally approved by SHPO. The ad for bid has been put in the papers. The Pre-Bid meeting will be around the 26th. Bids will be opened on July 9th.

Recorder Bigler read off the budget amount and the actual income. They are as follows:

The Mayor said he put an article in the newsletter about not doing the Spring Cleanup due to people not being able to read and follow instructions. C. Final Budget for FY Ending June 30, 2019.

Recorder Bigler and the Council went over the 2019 budget. The biggest issue concerns the grants. The grant we received for \$35,000 and the other grant for \$35,000 that was not done need to be taken out of the Parks budget total. Recorder Bigler had a question concerning the soccer budget. Council Member Kirgan asked about getting a raise for the City Council. The Mayor didn't feel there was enough money in the budget for the Council to get a raise.
